### Veterinary Testimonials

#### ***R.B., South Dakota***

This valuable show horse received a severe barbed-wire cut. Infection and gangrene had set in and the Vet, after using all conventional treatment methods, suggested that the horse be "put down" (killed). The wound was lasered daily resulting in rapid closure. After closure the scar was lasered once per week for 3 weeks, with the result being hair growing back in the scar tissue! The horse was able to return to the show ring, and has since produced 3 foals.

Just today, we treated 7 patients with low level laser therapy. Three of the most dramatic improvements include Theo, Maggie and Nike. Theo is an 8 year old cat with cruciate injury of 3 months duration. Before his knee surgery he received 3 laser treatments, his lameness resolved and the scheduled surgery was cancelled. Maggie is a 13 year old beagle that had lower back disc problems and bilateral



cruciate surgery in the past. She would moan and groan when trying to lie down. After her first treatment she climbed on the

kitchen counter and ate the cat food! Nike is a 5 year old schnauzer that presented with severe back pain. After his first treatment with low level laser therapy he was pain free! Dr. Tamara Shearer, OH

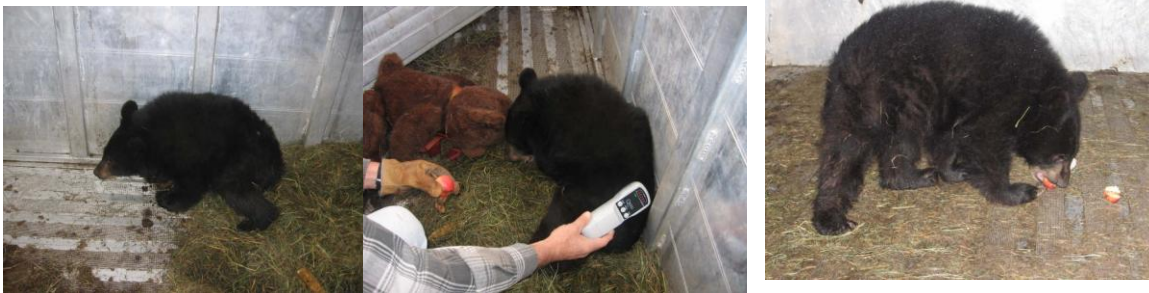
***Ruth Sawall, Fremont, WI***

Recently I caught a house finch that was sitting at the bird feeder. It had two severely infected eyes. One eye was completely swollen shut. The other eye was almost swollen shut. I used Mode 1 of my Q1000 for one cycle over each eye. Within 4 hours, the eyes were 80%

better, and continued to improve rapidly. I kept the bird and lasered the eyes one more time on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day. I did this for good measure before I let the bird go. The eyes looked completely healed – what a thrill!

### ***Trask Karrels***

I called and ordered another Q1000. Used recently on a stud horse - kicked in the hock, and was lame two days before a sale - one or two laser treatments eliminated the swelling and lameness, and the horse was the top-selling stud colt at the sale. Terry also had a "Monkey Bite" on her leg from getting kicked by a horse. Rodeo people say these usually take from 6 months to a year to subside. She lasered and over a period of 10 days, the wound was completely healed.



### ***A.V. veterinarian***

Baby Bear, a black bear cub, was found unable to move at the base of a large oak tree in Minnesota. An officer from the Department of Natural Resources recommended that Baby Bear be destroyed. A veterinarian was consulted and his report was grim saying that if Baby Bear had broken his back in the fall from the tree, surgery was not an option. The Q1000 and 808 Enhancer were applied directly over the broken back once per day. In 2 ½ weeks Baby Bear was no longer dragging his hind legs and also had some movement of his paralyzed legs. Baby Bear began sitting up after only 3 weeks of laser therapy, and was able to stand on all four legs with the help of the wall of his pen. After just four weeks of applying the Q1000 and 808 laser enhancer, Baby Bear was walking, eating and continuing to improve. Baby Bear “hibernated” in the trailer over the winter and was successfully released back to the wild the next spring.
